As I start this my last newsletter from Kenya, I am feeling rather sad. So far I have been hectically trying to get everything in place ready for our return to the UK on 11<sup>th</sup> July.



**Thank God the Project goes on.** The work continues to be urgent, and busier than ever! I am handing over control to **Rose Njoora** (those of you who have visited us would have met and remember Rose as a big hearted Kenyan retired head teacher who has been working with us in a voluntary capacity for the past 3 years). Along with her is a Committee headed by **Pastor James Karanja** (now Bishop Karanja) who has been working with us since the inception of the Project. **Susan Mwangi** is also on the management team (she has also been with us from the beginning). Our other staffs have been with us for many years and are fully committed to caring for Children here in Molo. We are in the process of training

Beatrice as a social worker.

We foresee a long involvement with the Project. I will be returning in December for an extended visit and then hope to phase out my involvement when things are stable. Our biggest challenge at present is neglected children. We are struggling to have an impact on the large number of young children who are suffering severe neglect by their parents. We are finding children as young as 1½ and 2 years been kept very dirty and left without food all day. We take these children into our day centre and try to help them, when we speak to these mothers about their treatment they are taken away and left at home again to suffer. Pray for the authorities as their only answer is to lock these mothers up
