Beatrice Kamau is continuing her training as a social worker.

Sonia Donnan is currently in Kenya for 5 weeks to visit and work on planned phase out of her involvement over the next few years. She and Chris continue to support and promote the Project in the UK and plans to lead teams to visit regularly. So you have not missed your opportunity to visit!

We continue to thank God for his provisions:

- Muffins and cookies continue to provide an income.
- Two sisters were admitted to St Thomas Aquinas Primary School in Elburgon.
- Please pray for the following family of four children in our care, their mother, Eunice is struggling. The four children are twin girls, (Sophie and Grace), one other sister (Judy) and one brother Pascal, (see 3<sup>rd</sup> photo above).
- Three children in severe difficulties were rescued from their mother who suffers from mental health issues
- For St Andrew's School regular Saturday morning visits of games and Bible lessons, (see first picture above)
- The wheat and maize on the rented field, ('shamba' in Kiswahili), are doing well.
- We managed to send another two students to university:
  - Elvis Museveni to study Bachelor of Science at Kimathi University in Nyeri
  - Elijah Ngige to study Industrial Chemistry at Egerton University in Njoro
- We were blessed by visits from students from Elite Primary School in Molo and Elite Secondary School in Nyahururu.

Prayer Points:

- Thank God and please pray for good results for 4 children we support who have done their KCSE (final secondary examinations) and that they would find productive activities to keep themselves busy while we await the results.
  - Cecilia, Jonah and Beatrice and George.
- Please pray for more finances to support our young people in university. (The loan they receive only covers tuition)
- Please pray for land or finances to buy land to be able to plant and grow our own food and to generate income.
- Please pray as we are in dire need for an Administrator and more workers
- More sponsorship for children going to school
- Desperate for funds – difficulty paying wages
